Cavovarus Deformity of Foot is not a common condition and is found very rarely but majority of cases of Cavovarus Deformity of Foot are found in patient with a history of Charcot-Marie-Tooth Disease which is a hereditary condition involving motor and sensory nerves with motor and sensory neuropathy. Cavovarus Deformity of Foot leads to ankle instability.

As the deformity worsens, there can be increasing pain at the ankle due to recurrent sprains, painful calluses at the side of the foot or base of the toes, or difficulty with shoe wear. Causes. Cavovarus foot realignment with anteromedial ankle cheilectomy reliably improved patients' symptoms related to ankle arthrosis, restored lateral hindfoot stability, and stabilized the extent of anteromedial ankle arthrosis when talar varus tilt was reduced.

A cavovarus foot deformity usually appears during childhood. The arch is very high and the heel slants inward. Both feet are often affected and the misalignment gradually worsens over time. Pain, calluses, ankle sprains and stress fractures are all common results of cavovarus foot deformity.

In cavovarus foot deformity, the relatively strong peroneus longus and tibialis posterior muscles cause a hindfoot varus and forefoot valgus (pronated) position. Hindfoot varus causes overload of the lateral border of the foot, resulting in ankle instability, peroneal tendinitis, and stress fracture.

A cavus foot has a high arch. The cavus can range from being slightly high to severely deformed, causing a patient to walk on the outside of the foot. Surgery sometimes is needed to realign the foot. While the cause of a high-arched foot it often unknown, a cavus could be caused by nerve disease, clubfoot, or injury.

posterior tibialis typically is markedly stronger than evertors and maintains strength for a long time in most cavovarus feet may consider transfer of posterior tibialis to dorsum of foot if severe dorsiflexion weakness of anterior tibialis lengthening of gastrocnemius or tendoachilles (TAL)

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Describes a deformity which consists of 2 components: a) Cavus of the foot with a plantar flexed 1st metatarsal and b) A varus heel in most cases accompanied by a muscular imbalance with tibialis posterior and peroneus longus overpull and a weakness of the tibialis anterior and peroneus brevis muscle.

Introduction The term cavus is a descriptor of the shape of the foot that includes a higher-than-average arch. It is part of a continuum of foot shape that includes a low arch and a neutral arch in which the transitions are incompletely defined. The cavus

Cavovarus foot refers to a foot that has both cavus (high arch) and varus of the heel (a heel that is turned inward). It is not as common in presentation as flatfoot. It can occur in very obvious forms in patients with Charcot-Marie-Tooth (i.e. hereditary motor sensory neuropathy) or can have a very subtle variant as well in otherwise normal patients.

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Abstract. Twenty-one feet in fifteen patients underwent osteotomies of the calcaneus and one or more metatarsals for symptomatic cavovarus foot deformity. Seven (nine feet) were male, and eight (twelve feet) were female. The etiology included hereditary motor sensory neuropathy (HMSN) (fifteen feet), post-polio syndrome (two feet), sacral cord lipomenigocele (two feet), parietal lobe porencephalic cyst (one foot), and idiopathic peripheral neuropathy (one foot).

A cavovarus foot deformity is characterized by a higher-than-normal arch of the inner midfoot. This results as the two ends of the foot - the heel and toes - abnormally draw towards the inside of the foot, causing the foot to rest on its outer side.

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Nonoperative treatment of the cavovarus foot generally has been unsuccessful, although a brace may help manage symptoms of drop foot and ankle instability. 65 In active patients with mild lateral ankle ligament laxity, a simple figure-of-eight Velcro-strap ankle brace often is sufficient. 65,82 For more severe foot drop, a posterior spring-leaf AFO provides dorsiflexion assistance and is lightweight and easy to transfer between shoes.

Many procedures in reconstructive or trauma surgery of the foot and ankle may need to be revised, particularly those that result in a cavovarus deformity of the foot. Generally, this is a result of a malposition, particularly of the hindfoot, when the patient ambulates.
