Cleft lip and palate - NHS

Cleft lip and palate are openings or splits in the upper lip or roof of the mouth (palate). A child can be born with a cleft lip, cleft palate, or both. Cleft lip and palate may be the only birth defects, or they may happen with other defects. A cleft lip may be as mild as a notch of the lip.

In a few families there is a strong inherited tendency to cleft lip and palate. A small number of babies are born with a cleft lip and/or palate because they have a chromosome abnormality. What are genes and chromosomes and why are they important? Genes can be thought of as the "blueprint" for the body.

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## Chromosome Tests (Children with Cleft Lip and Palate)

Children with a cleft lip or palate will be monitored closely as they grow and develop. This will include their hearing, jaw and teeth development and speech. Most children are able to develop good speech and language skills following surgery. But sometimes a repaired cleft palate can make it difficult for a child to pronounce some sounds clearly.

Cleft lip and cleft palate occur when tissues in the baby's face and mouth don't fuse properly. Normally, the tissues that make up the lip and palate fuse together in the second and third months of pregnancy. But in babies with cleft lip and cleft palate, the fusion never takes place or occurs only part way, leaving an opening (cleft).

## Cleft lip and cleft palate - Symptoms and causes - Mayo Clinic

Some children with a cleft lip can also have a cleft defect in the alveolus - the bone that holds our teeth in place. If there is an alveolar cleft, the teeth near it may erupt in the wrong place or may not erupt at all. Sometimes, the teeth near a cleft may be absent, have an unusual shape or there can be extra teeth.

Some children have a cleft lip or cleft palate because of changes in their genes. Cleft lip and cleft palate are thought to be caused by a combination of genes and other factors, such as things the mother comes in contact with in her environment, or what the mother eats or drinks, or certain medications she uses during pregnancy.

## Cleft lip and palate - Treatment - NHS

Research has shown that during the early preschool years (ages 3-5), children with cleft lip or cleft palate tend to have a self-concept that is similar to their peers without a cleft. However, as they grow older and their social interactions increase, children with clefts tend to report more dissatisfaction with peer relationships and higher levels of social anxiety .

One of the goals of cleft treatment is that affected children have good quality, intelligible (understandable) speech by 5 years old so they can start school with confidence. Around half of all children with a cleft palate (with or without a cleft lip) will need some form of speech and language therapy to achieve this.

## Cleft Lip & Palate Association

Many children with a cleft of the lip and palate will have missing teeth, particularly in the line of the cleft. They may also have extra teeth, misshapen or malformed teeth. Because of this, their teeth can be crowded, tilted or rotated.

Babies who are born with cleft lip have a gap or opening in the upper lip. This happens when the baby's lip doesn't form properly early in pregnancy, resulting in a split. A cleft lip can be: on one side of the lip (a unilateral cleft lip).

There are particular times when a child with a cleft may be more vulnerable and in need of support, including times of change (moving up in academic year or changing schools) and before operations. It is important to remember that many children with a cleft do very well at school and do not need additional support.

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
